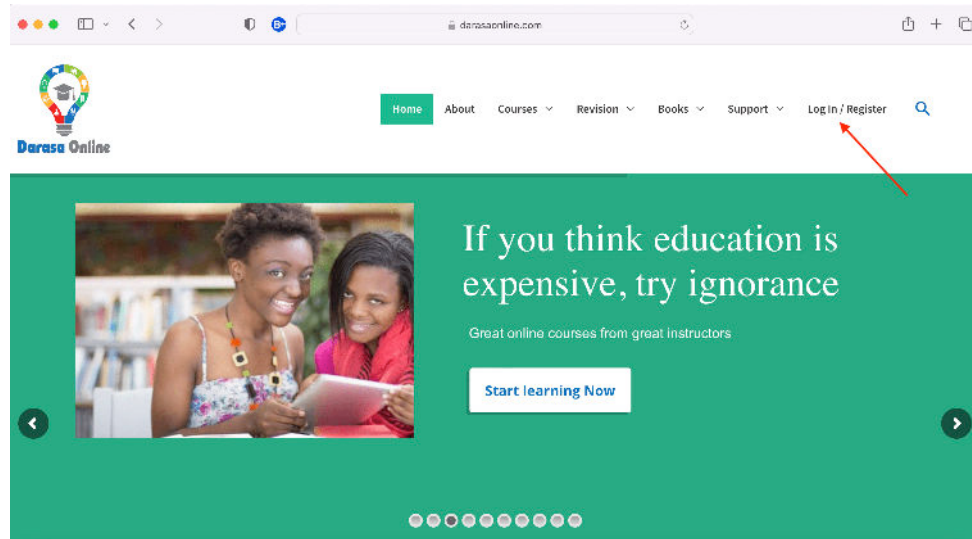
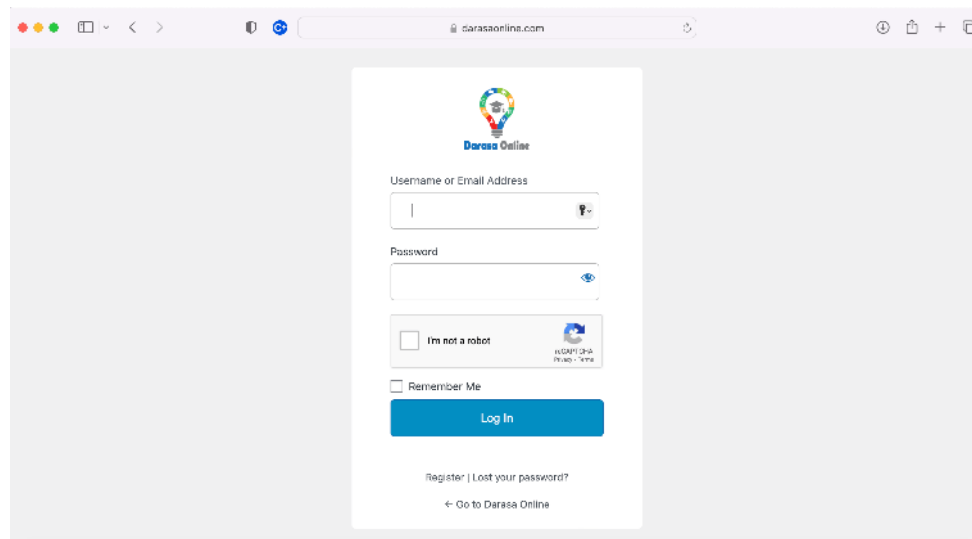


## How to access your purchased e-books in the portal

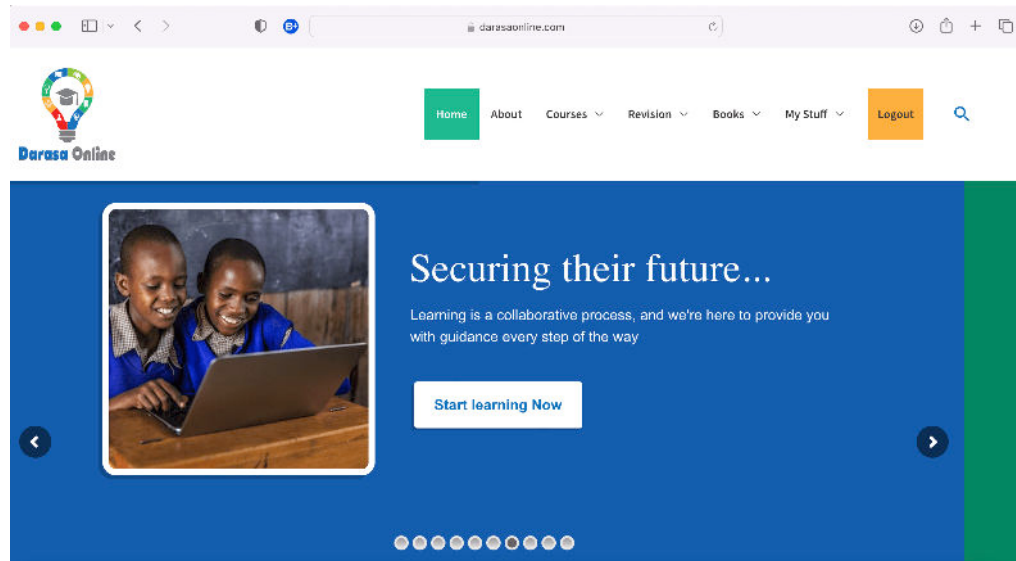
1. Click on “Login/Register” (you must first be registered on Darasa Online)



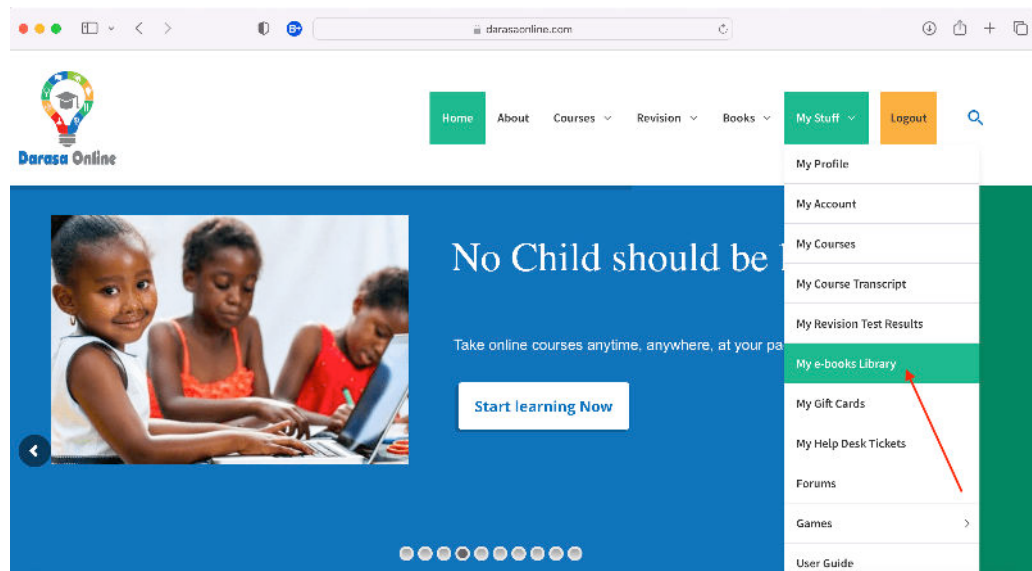
2. Enter your user name or email, password, select “I’m not a robot”, and click on “Log in”

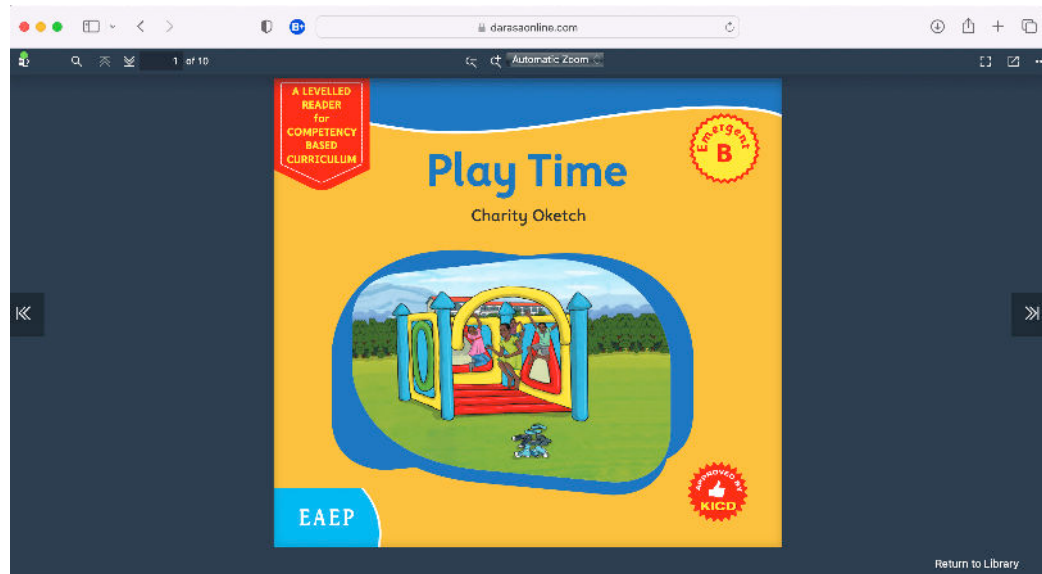
